10 Tips for a Healthy Eating Plan

- 1. Calcium rich foods, such as milk and cheese, are important to compensate for loss of bone density associated with aging.
- 2. Avoid food rich in saturated fat, and whenever possible, use olive oil.
- 3. To help ensure a healthy lifestyle for the elderly, make sure they get lots of fluid, despite their decreasing thirst. They should concentrate on increasing their fluid intake, especially of milk and water.

Tea, coffee, and other fluid intake should be in moderation. Coffee should be the decaffeinated variety to prevent leaching needed calcium out of their bones and organs.

- 4. Fruits that are rich in Vitamin C, such as strawberries, apples, and citrus fruits should be incorporated into their daily diet.
- 5. Vegetables, especially those with high levels of Vitamin A and Vitamin C, such as carrots, spinach, avocados, sweet potatoes, and broccoli should be consumed on a daily basis.
- 6. Fish high in omega-3 and vitamin E are beneficial to the elderly. Due to their texture and nutritional value, they are a good alternative to red meat. Avoid farm-raised salmon. Wild is best.
- 7. Antioxidants should be an important part of diets to combat free radicals. Select the best antioxidant juice and have them take it at least twice a day. Three times is better. That alone can well ensure a healthy lifestyle for your elderly loved ones.
- 8. Alcohol and sugary drinks should be kept to a minimum.
- 9. Fiber plays an important part of a healthy diet, too.
- 10. The elderly frequently suffer from tooth loss and may have dentures. Foods should be cooked to a soft texture, so it is easier to chew and digest.

Keep Mobile

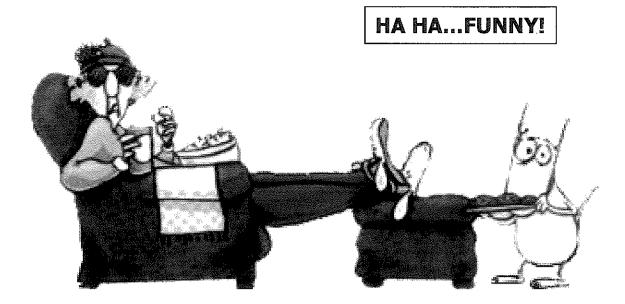
- 1. Contrary to the common notion that the elderly should be indoors, experts advise them to keep active.
- 2. Keeping active not only improves their health, but it also keeps them happy and stress free.
- 3. Exercise should be done in moderation and consistently.
- 4. Consult your doctor, especially if you have any history of medical problems.
- 5. It is more important to keep moving as we age to prevent an increased risk of certain health conditions.
- 6. Activity keeps the heart pumping and reduces the risks of cardiovascular diseases, arthritis, and obesity.

The elderly, especially those who live alone, are prone to loneliness and depression. The stress of modern day living can also affect their mental state. Evaluate their diet, their mental state and ensure that nothing impedes the healthy lifestyle for your elderly loved ones.

By staying connected to a social network for occasional outings and meetings, the elderly are able to have a sense of belonging and general well-being.

The best support network is the support of family and friends. Keeping an eye out for our elderly parents, grandparents, relatives, and even neighbors will go a long way into ensuring they live a happy and fulfilled life.

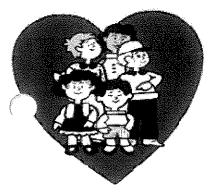

REQUESTED ACTION: Discuss the possibility of making all apartments "smoke free".

Comments: It has been several years since we have adopted our policy to maintain most of the apartments as "smoke free". We were one of the first Housing Authorities to do this. However, since then HUD has sent out a few notices recommending that this practice be adopted.

We have been discussing the possibility of converting the smoking units we have to no smoking units also. We currently have 12 units at the NCT and 12 at the SCT; in addition to all of the units at Morningside. Trying to maintain a separate waiting list for the smoking units has been difficult and I am not sure that it is in compliance with the regulations.

Out of the 12 units at SCT, there are smokers in 9 of the units. Out of the 12 units at NCT, there are smokers in 5 of the units. At Morningside about half of the tenants are smokers. In addition there are about 4 residents who were grandfathered in and are able to smoke in non-smoking units. These tenants could be grandfathered in and still be allowed to smoke in their units. However, all new tenants would have to go outside to smoke. Another possibility would be to revise everyone's lease and ban smoking inside for everyone.

We plan to discuss this with the residents at the next Resident Advisory Board Meeting.
